Turning 18 is a BIG DEAL, not just from a parent's emotional perspective, but legally too. Eighteen is a magic birthday, a milestone into adulthood accompanied by great privileges as well as serious legal implications.

An eighteen years old girl in Saida mean many things and making several things. Moreover, she has the right to work, marriage, travel, completing knowledge, driving and else...

I am Palestinian living in Lebanon and us as Palestinian are deprived of many rights in Lebanon. For example, we are deprived the right of owning a home.

Setting plans

The process of setting goals helps us to choose where we want to be in our life, what we want in our life, and what steps we need to take in our life to achieve our goals as we have planned. Personal plan is the most important step we need to take it. Personal plan helps us to move forward towards our career hunting for a job, to start our own business, and also our future with our family. Therefore, I have set some plans to achieve my goals.

At 18, you have to be more a c c o u n t a b l e for your actions, so doing crazy things should not be an option. You're considered an adult. You're at the age when you can start working, go to the college to complete knowledge and make the major I want.

You have to be conscientious; it's not the start of your wild years where you get crazy just because you're legal. You can still have fun, but remember that people are watching. You'll still make mistakes as you try to find your way, but don't forget everything you were taught.

First of all, get a drivers license, apply in the military sector, vote in election, work in my specialty, follow up my university studies, work full time, open a bank account and training at an institution for experience

Work

I'd like to be an engineer in the future.

Driving License

Young people in Sidon, alum, feel happy when they get a driver's notebook so they can buy a car.

Education/university

I suffer from many difficulties at work, as the Palestinian in Lebanon is deprived of many jobs such as opening a dental clinic, opening a pharmacy, a law office. And I must work because of the university tuition payment.





Travel

18 years old in Saida have the right to get passport and travel without the signature of his parents.

I am 18 years old and my dream is to travel, but unfortunately I have the right to issue a passport and not to travel to any country I want and not at any time.

I hope to travel to a country which respect all their citizens regardless of their nationality and give them their rights.

Marriage

If a person doesn't want to study he/ she can marry, have a family, and have children. At the age of 18 I am entitled to choose my life partner.

If he was a Lebanese man, he would have the right to give me Lebanese citizenship and every dream that would have been impossible because I am Palestinian, now I can achieve it.

I wish to marry from a person who loves, deserves me and to build a successful family and to have children to raise them up in good values, norms and traditions.

I will prove to my parents and all who surrounds me that I will be a wife, a successful and responsible youngster to my home an important and successful position in my or any society that I will line in.

Bank account

The rule of any bank to open an account is the age it should be eighteen.



Elections


A person 18 years old have the right to vote and chose the one who you see the best. I am not entitled to be elected in the ELECTIONS.



"With knowledge, the greatest glory of the nations is sensed, and no promotion for the nations without knowledge," said GIBRAN KHALIL GIBRAN. Growing up, I was always taught that knowledge is power, that education is the only weapon we have against the injustice in our countries, that I'll only be a strong independent confident woman by educating myself and getting the highest degrees, one of the reasons why I grew up to be obsessed with the future, and passionate about wanting to be more. Some days, I get fully convinced that even the most powerful weapon, education, is not enough to stand against the injustice in our reality and the systems for our countries. I, every day, struggle with the old facts and curriculum of the Lebanese Education System.



I try to remember the sparkles I see in the eyes of homeless hungry children begging in the streets as I also keep in mind the admirable strength that the heart of every Arab woman fighting to get what she wants, and the fact that every teen who lives in Saida had to go through hopelessness to end up fighting to become who they've dreamed to be. All these details give me hope to fix what's wron

Honestly, I believe that one of the few things that change with turning 18 in Saida is education Most of the time, those who turn 18 in Lebanon graduate from high school and attend university to study what they are passionate about. And since by passions and dreams the best future for the nations is built, turning 18 indirectly gives the chance for youth to raise their voices and get them heard. Education gives the 18 year-olds in Saida the power they need to make the lives of theirs and everyone living in Lebanon better. In Saida, education is an important thing for residents and refugees as well. As a teenager reaches 18, everything differs for him/her, a new period appears quietly in his/her life to take him/her to a new, unique, and different stage.

My grandfather said: "In the past, education wasn't allowed for girls, only boys were able to continue their education." In 2020 everything has changed, a teenager whether a boy or a girl or a handicapped can choose their universities, majors, and years of studying. On the other hand, all of them need motivation from their parents to continue this road. Perhaps university is the playground and the fun journey of becoming 18. Our passions and interests are developed at the university while we study our most desirable subjects. Universities are also an environment where we can develop social and personal skills.



When a person turns 18 in Saida, he/she doesn't sense a change. The philosophy of being 18 isn't quite familiar in Saida, due to specific beliefs that are prevailed or not prevailed in the saidonian society, which come against this "new phenomenon". Still, 18-year-olds in Saida are aware of the challenges that face them and stand in their way of discovering themselves. Usually, this age is known for being the age of maturity and responsibility. Most teenagers in Saida hold responsibility from a very young age. A lot of factors affect the feature of responsibility in teens in Saida. One of them is Saida's small are compared to Beirut for example, which lessens teens' temptations and therefore makes them more responsible as individuals, even if not in a direct way. However, based on the huge effect that parents have on their children's' lives in the saidonian society, for them, turning 18 is officially becoming responsible for your family. Teens and specifically boys get crowned as "the boss of the house". But most of these 18-yearolds aren't given the chance to be responsible in their societies. Letting us know our responsibilities, our personal information is easier to see our lives on. We should also be responsible for our academic studies, and take good care of ourselves. Besides, we shall also develop job skills by working in a local place in Saida, to support our families. Turning 18 opens the door to many privileges, but with privileges comes responsibility. That may seem scary at first.

When does a baby bird leave the nest? Seriously? No one noticed? Well, guess it's just me. But surely everyone notices when a mother's baby around them leaves home.

Being 18-years-old is a teen-s dream!! Who wouldn't want to discover the world? Remember when we were all forced to enjoy those family vacations to places that are not on our "to visit list". Who has authority? Unfortunately, not all families in Saida do give their teens complete freedom, but hey! Change is on the way. Then honestly all the procedures go smoothly.

Work on getting a visa, but if you don't know how then, ah.... Well just don't give up. Wake up on a fresh Monday, ready to have blast on your plane to France. You have to pack if you're a female, we both know you'd need 5 bags and 3 purses for 1 week, if you're a male, just your backpack would do. If you think that's all, then you're total...WRON®.You're going to have a big tour through all of your cousin's houses, it's not preferable, I know, but then again you have to keep your parents happy, they're still financing your vacation. Seriously, being 18 opens up new roads, independence and of course TRAVELLING! Lebanon, including Saida, is one of the safest countries in the Middle East. The only reasons why its not considered as such are the media and inaccurate Government travel advice and warnings. Discovering new hidden places, walking around the old sooks of Saida, or maybe doing trips around the city, is the most exciting part of becoming 18. More personal space is available for us upon turning 18, which will allow us to make life long memories.



18 girls or boys in Saida can get permission for **driving** from the Ministry of Interior. She/he can get their **cars**, they can go wherever and whenever they want but it must be inside **Lebanon**. **Driving** motivates teens to make trips, meet people, and it facilitates their life. Turning 18 is the end of sweet childhood where the fun has begun, do what you feel like and like what you do. At the beginning of this journey, most of us like to learn driving. We think that everything in life is somewhere in it that we may get by getting a car.

Although public transportation is important but having a car will give him/her the bravery and the FREEDOM to roam where they want. To drive will let us socialize more with others and will give us the chance to achieve our desires, where well have the freedom to go everywhere we want and meet more people. Moreover, well have more chances to participate in charities or art sessions. Also, we may be like a tourist in our own country which is an incredible adventure that makes us appreciate where we're from by going trips or doing camping so we can be like a tourist exploring our country's favorite places and geography. Most of us want to drive and feel ready to handle responsibility. Above these, we shouldn't forget that we're in Saida. Living in Saida is more different than any country and to compare it. Although driving has many advantages on us, but being in Saida is much harder. Not all 18 can drive and buy a car in this bad economic conditions, our parents can't put us in classes to learn driving and get the driver's license (knowing that in Lebanon we get in at the age 18) and have your cars, so it may take more time to drive in this city. Indeed, most of our parents have a lot of these responsibilities: the university that they should pay, furthermore the living matters they give to the family.

The phase of our life that is submerged with youth and consciousness, we determine our future and tape up our dreams back (because tape fixes everything). It is the horizon where I can stretch out my wings and fly, now it certainly great, but that doesn't mean that it is a constant euphoria, it comes with hardships because the more decisions you make the more you wonder if you made the right one or not, and your caught in this dilemma, left to wonder what if? 18 in Saida, the place I was born in... reminds me of the childhood that I never got to grasp and never well, and I just have to live there tormented by my own memories, such an irony. Besides the suffocating pressure there isn't much change in my life, I get to listen to the rain in bed say goodbye to the boats in the morning go to school have fun with the folks. And as the melody of the past plays the future shall play its own, creating a gracious symphony where childhood and adulthood clash under the aurora of time... Ahh such a masterpiece.




